

### Mildred Chisholm Rudisill

(1909 - 1943)

Mildred was born 5/6/1909 in Troy North Carolina, a daughter of William Fred Chisholm (wife - Minnie). Minnie was the Mrs. Chisholm with the tiny store mentioned on p.1 of author Jerry Bledsoe's 1989 book "Country Cured" with which he recalled his early childhood memories in Thomasville NC. William and Minnie are buried in High Point, NC.

Mildred's grandfather William J. Chisholm was born in 1843 in Troy NC. William was a Confederate veteran having served in the Army of Northern Virginia under General Robert E. Lee. Corporal Chisholm enlisted in Montgomery County on March 1 1862 as a Private in Co. E 28th Regiment NC Troops. He was present or accounted for until paroled at Farmville VA. April; 11-21 1865. (source NC Troops 1861-1865 28th Regiment). William's grave stone recognizes and honors his service in the Confederate States Army. He was buried with many family members including his parents, John and Mary Chisholm, in the Chisholm Family Cemetery in Troy NC.

Mildred was the wife of Carl Rudisill, whose German ancestry is documented in "The Rudisill Genealogy" by Ted Rudisill, and the mother of four daughters. Mildred left the four young girls when she died of leukemia as a very young woman. By the grace of God the daughters have been blessed and are alive as of early 2018. Helen Everhart (husband - Tom), now 91 years old, was married 73 years when widowed in 2017, and lives in Thomasville, NC. Doris (Dot) Russell (husband - Lawrence), now 87 years old has been married 70 years and lives with her husband in Thomasville, NC. Imogene Deal (husband - Roger) now 85 years old was widowed in 2009 after 59-1/2 years of marriage, lives in Denton NC. And the baby girl Patricia (Pat) Long (husband-Billy), now 80 years old lives in Asheboro, NC.

Mildred was buried in the Thomasville City Cemetery in 1943. Her husband Carl was laid to rest beside her in 1970.
